2 BCS – Making IT Good for Society

3 Royal Institute of British Architects

The RIBA has a rigorous framework in place to ensure that our chartered members maintain their competence in key architectural skills. However since the tragic fire at Grenfell Tower in June 2017, being able to provide proof of competence and professionalism is even more essential. Thus the provision of CPD recording to track activities has gained in importance. Also in the 21st century, easy to use digital services are key to membership retention and service. The RIBA recently launched the first milestone in a multi-phase digital learning environment for members with our new recording platform. Working across teams, and with our chosen technology partners, Meta Capability, the RIBA's new CPD recording site offers chartered members an easy to use intuitive platform.

Joni Tyler, Head of CPD at RIBA, will show how the platform works, how it was planned for, how the RIBA managed the specification and procurement, and how a collaborative, organization-wide approach ensured success. She will also look at subsequent phases in the RIBA's digital development.

4 CPD Preferences among Accountants

Nelson Croom is a publisher of online CPD resources. Trading as accountingcpd.net, they are the leading provider of online CPD to accountants in the UK and in several key

international markets. They recently completed a major research project, surveying over 1000 accountants about their preferences, including for example how they do their CPD, what they do, where they do it, how long they like each session to be and who pays. The research produced some interesting results and the size of the sample enabled them to cut the data, drilling down into how particular groups of professionals differed in their behaviour from the norm.

Alan Nelson, CEO, will share the results of the research and the sub groups or “personas’ they identified, and facilitate break out discussions to investigate the possible implications of the results. The presenters are particularly interested to explore the reactions of Forum members from other sectors, and to have their findings cross-fertilized by questions and comments from other professions.
